

Quick Cover

Single layer cover for a book or folder

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Measurements and a tiny bit of math:

- Measure height of folder, then add 5 cm
- Measure circumference of object, then add 20 cm
- Cut your fabric using the two measurements

Optional:


- If you can see unwanted prints through the fabric use an extra layer of muslin or thin cotton fabric as lining.
- Add thin batting and quilt.

Rule of thumb for cutting:

Height plus 5 cm
Circumference plus 20 cm

Finish all raw edges.

On the short sides of your fabrics fold the edges 1 cm over towards the



Place fabric right side up on the table.

Fold each of the short sides over itself. This will create the sleeves on each side.

The resulting rectangular fabric (with both sides folded over) should now be as wide as the book's circumference plus 2-5 mm.

(If you have used batting or lining allow an extra 2 – 5 mm)

Between the two sleeve areas is some of the right side of the fabric visible. Measure and mark the upper and lower edges depending on your book's height plus 2 – 5 mm (depending on thickness of your book cover). Mark your fabric only on the wrong side of the fabric. Sew, turn and then try if it fits.

Once everything fits, trim the corners diagonally. Turn and press. You can now fold the long edges over and hem them.

To insert the book, open the book and insert the stiff hardcover into one sleeve. Open the book all the way, bend the other hardcover and insert it in the second sleeve.



Works well to transform a simple notebook into a elegant travel journal.
